When I first read this play I was so moved by what a generous offering it was. It feels generous both in how personal it is, and how it offers us a space to grapple and reflect on what kind of society we want to live in.

It can feel like such an overwhelming and isolating time when so much of our public discourse is happening on social media. This show does what theatre does best by bringing us into the same room to imagine together. You might feel uncomfortable, then you might laugh – while the person sitting beside you is feeling the exact opposite way. And what a gift that is – especially right now – to bring us together across divides, to be entertained and to consider big questions.

With both the American election approaching, and a Canadian one on the horizon, it felt exciting and necessary to consider this story for our stage. I reached out to the wonderful playwright, Heidi Schreck, and asked if she might consider working with us on adapting it to speak to a Canadian audience. I was thrilled when she said that she would, and this Canadian premiere now marks the first production of this show outside of America. I am so grateful to Nightwood Theatre, Necessary Angel, and Talk is Free Theatre for coming on board.

We've had a wonderful and reflective time over the past few months talking about what Canada's Constitution means to us – we hope you can join in reflecting on what it means to you.

HEIDI SCHRECK is a writer and performer living in Brooklyn. Her critically-acclaimed play What the Constitution Means to Me played an extended, sold-out run on Broadway in 2019, and was nominated for two Tony Awards. It had subsequent runs at the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., the Mark Taper Forum, the Guthrie, Seattle Repertory Theatre and the McCarter Theatre, as well as theatres in Houston, Miami,

Omaha, Nashville, Charlotte and Chicago. A filmed version of the play premiered on Amazon Prime Video, and was nominated for a Critics Choice Award, a PGA Award and DGA Award. What the Constitution Means to Me was named Best of the Year by The New York Times, The Los Angeles Times, The Chicago Tribune, Time Magazine, The Hollywood Reporter, The New Yorker and more. Schreck's other plays Grand Concourse, Creature, and There Are No More Big Secrets have also been produced in NYC and all over the country. Screenwriting credits include I Love Dick, Billions, Nurse Jackie, Dispatches from Elsewhere and shows in development with Amazon Studios, Plan B and A24. She is the recipient of three Obie Awards, a Drama Desk Award and a Theatre World Award, as well as the Horton Foote Playwriting Award and the Hull-Warriner Award from the Dramatists Guild. Schreck was awarded Smithsonian Magazine's 2019 American Ingenuity Award, for her work in the Performing Arts.

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

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

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
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
